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


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








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EDITOR'S LETTER

India is the biggest market for Sri Lanka in terms of tourism arrivals

he 67th Travel Agents
Association of India (TAAI)'s
three-day annual convention
reiterated Sri Lanka as a peaceful,
tourist-friendly destination.

Sri Lanka President H E Ranil Wickremesinghe officially inaugurated the TAAI convention at Bandaranaike Memorial International Conference Hall (BMICH), said: "Gathering 600 delegates for the convention brings back faith in Sri Lanka's Tourism. We are restructuring our debts. Tourism can help in getting back the economy. We are an island nation with good beaches and have the scope to develop high-end tourism products like in Maldives.

There are so many natural and heritage attractions in Sri Lanka. Dakshin Kashi and 2000year old Velu Murugan temple at Kataragama are testimony to historical ties between India and Sri Lanka." H. E. also suggested attractions to look out for, like the Galle Festival in January, Jaffna's traditional Festival, where thousands of people gather and also some unique experiences like a Russian chef running a Japanese restaurant in Colombo, plantation bungalows, boutique hotels, Sri Lankan cuisine and many more.

573 delegates, including 50 media members, attended TAAI Convention from the 6th to the 9th in Colombo. The event's business sessions and B2B meets were held at Cinnamon Grand on the 7th and Shangri-La Colombo on the 8th.

Chalaka Gajabahu, chairman of Sri Lanka Tourism Promotion Bureau (SLTPB), the government body responsible for handling all marketing and promotion activities for the island nation, said: "It's reassuring to have so many delegates descending here on our Island nation that has all attractions of tourism, with only the exception of snow. It had seemed like a challenge when the idea of hosting the event in Colombo came up three months ago. Sri Lanka is on the right path of recovery, and we are developing a 360 campaign to reassure tourists worldwide."

India is the biggest market for Sri Lanka in terms of tourism arrivals and that is likely to be the case in the long term as well.

"In terms of numbers, right now, India is the number one source market for us and I'm pretty sure it's going to stay there for the next couple of years and for our long-term plans as well," he said.

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
Gajabahu said the country has already got over 600,000 incoming tourists till June 30. "Our last year's overall figure was 720,000. Our target is to get 1.55 million tourists. 2018 was the best year in terms of travel for us as we got 2.3 million tourists. If we can get close to 2 million, it will be a massive recovery for us," he said.

Referring to the economic crisis, he said the country is moving forward in terms of the economic situation and debt restructuring. "We are moving forward through support from the World Bank, Asian Development Bank, IMF, and the EU programmes that are all in process. Yes, there is criticism about it but even though there is criticism, there is no solution. If there is criticism, there should also be solutions. Right now, the current government is offering solutions and we are moving forward," he said ...

"The economic situation has improved drastically. The fuel crisis and the medicine crisis are not there any more. The dollar rates for us are not where they were. Without a proper campaign, the little bits that we did starting with India, China, London, Germany and the Middle East paid off. We participated in travel shows and roadshows. The numbers are coming in," he added.

Jyoti Mayal, President of TAAI, said: "We all go through ups and downs, whether in professional or personal life. The tourism industry becomes vulnerable during a crisis, but it's also an industry that is resilient and stands for peace. We are happy to extend our domestic market to our neighbouring island of Sri Lanka and help the country bounce back." Ms Mayal added that previous conventions of TAAI had proven that the host country's arrivals increase many folds following the event as it gets media coverage followed by members' selling the destination better after their first-hand experience.

Jyoti Mayal said there are certain things that the government has done which have not come into the limelight. "The Indian currency is going to be accepted here. You can spend your money here. The governments have



agreed to do that. As the oldest nodal travel and tourism association of India, we are collaborating with each other to bring out the best products for the country," she said.

"We will stand by them to say that we all prosper together in this. Whenever we travel as a convention, the interest of the general people also rises, she added.

Nishad Wijetunga, president of the Sri Lanka Association of Inbound Tour Operators (SLAITO), said, "We wanted to change the perception of Sri Lanka worldwide with this event. We have enough food, medicines and everything needed to handle tourists. Inflation came down 14 per cent last month along the road to recovery. Tourism is our country's second most economic earner, and we welcome tourists to experience the warm hospitality of our people and help rebuild our economy.

He said, said out of the 600,000 tourist arrivals, at least 30-40% would be from India.


"India has been the biggest source market. Even going back in time, every time we have had a crisis when we have come to a real crunch, it is India that has come to our rescue. At the moment the top markets are India and Russia. The UK was a very big market. Hopefully, it should come back," he added.

Wijetunga said a lot of MICE projects have come to Sri Lanka in the past three months and he is hoping this will continue. "We had a forex crisis in this country. We spent six months from June to December last year trying to convince our generative markets that the situation was improving. That we had food and medicines and that our people were okay," he said. "But the future is looking good. The cruises have started. The new ferry from Pondicherry to Sri Lanka will be a huge game changer. That means crossing over to Sri Lanka at a very nominal price, he added.


Everything in the Tri-Valley is deeply connected to the past. Even its wines are richly steeped in tradition.

The best-known monument in Kandy is the sacred pilgrimage site of the Temple of the Tooth, said to house one of the Buddha's teeth.

The relic of the tooth of the Buddha symbolizes fourth-century traditions that used to be linked to royalty since the protector of the relic was seen to be fit enough to rule the land. Thus, the Royal Palace and the Temple of the Tooth were associated with the administrative and religious functions of the capital city. During July or August every year, Sri Lanka's grandest




celebration takes place, the Kandy Esala Perahera. The ten-day festival ends on the night of the full Moon, its highlight is a procession of drummers, dancers, and decorated elephants carrying a duplicate of the Buddha's sacred tooth.

of southern Midtown and northern Downtown San Antonio. The old brewery complex was transformed into an eclectic entertainment, dining, residential, hotel and retail destination. The weekend Pearl Farmers Market attracts thousands, as do annual events such as the Monarch Butterfly and Pollinator Festival in October.

4. Roam around Southtown

It's hard to find a neighbourhood cooler than Southtown. Picturesque scenery, walkable streets, great restaurants, a bustling art scene and a deeply rooted community — this San Antonio neighbourhood has it all.

San Antonio's other great urban renewal story, Southtown, has transformed from a derelict industrial



area into a thriving art, eating and historical district. Spend an afternoon touring Ruby City, a world-renowned contemporary art museum designed by starchitect Sir David Adjaye, or support local art with a stop at Blue Star Arts Complex, a mix of studios, stores, and cafes. The San Antonio Art League & Museum, located in an 1896 house, boasts 600 pieces in its permanent collection, and mostly features works by Texas artists. The St. Mary's Strip, a bustling boulevard that runs from Southtown north through downtown and Tobin Hill, is brimming with the restaurants, shops and cafes that make this neighbourhood so popular.

5. Have a drink in downtown bars

There's no denying that San Antonio's a fantastic place to sip on a margarita on the city's iconic River Walk or drink a spicy michelada while floating in the pool at one of the many









great hotels and resorts. But San Antonio has cultivated a sophisticated cocktail culture over the past several years that rivals any other major city in Texas—or the U.S. At least if you know where to look. Several new spots have opened in the past couple of years and you'll find those here, along with a handful of can't-miss mainstays for everything from beer and wine to elaborate flaming tiki cocktails. 6. Savor San Antonio cuisine -


7. See historic missions -





Ras Abroug (Zekreet)



Fuwairit Beach


